THE MINIMUM WAGE IN AUSTRALIA

Estimated minimum wage is \$16.80 per hour compared to \$15 which is an extra \$68.40 a week or \$3,556.80 a year. This is also \$40.40 more than the ACTU claim for an extra \$28 a week. 82.6% of Australians support an increase to the minimum wage.

1.36 million people earn minimum wages.

This is more than double Tasmania's entire population which is 507,600.
