#### Background

Africa's last colony: for 30 years the people of Western Sahara have been striving for selfdetermination. Morocco continues to block the decolonisation process, obstructing the UN referendum. Malainin Lakhal's tour will raise awareness of this struggle and build support for self-determination for the Saharawi people.



Malainin Lakhal grew up in Western Sahara under Moroccan occupation. In 2000, sought by police for his part in peaceful protests in favour of independence, he escaped to the refugee camps near Tindouf in Algeria. Here he helps to bring the daily human rights abuses inflicted by Morocco on his fellow Saharawis to the notice of the world.
